

# **PUCARA PIPELINE**

**IAR 36771 (SW suri male by ILR Pperuvian Amador G4582 (S) (SW) b 19 June 1999**

## **Summary**

This analysis is prepared by Blaydon Management for Jeff McNeill of Tambo Downs Alpacas.

Pucara Pipeline is a SW male suri certified for stud duties in Australia on 2 May 2005. At the time of writing, he has 18 registered crias in Australia and New Zealand.

## **Show Ring Performance**

Pipeline only went to show during 2000 and 2001 but, in that short period, made a huge impact at the highest level. As a junior, he scored a broad ribbon at AlpacaFest (Victoria) and then went on to take out the Supreme Champion title at the 2000 Royal Melbourne Show as an Intermediate Class Male. Just weeks later, he repeated that broad ribbon at the National Show. His full results:

## **Sire Line**

Pipeline is a son of the popular US-bred ILR Pperuvian Amador G4582 (S) (SW), one of 30 to have gone to stud in Australasia. This is a most successful sire line. The following successful sire sons of Amador have show broad ribbon winners amongst their progeny:

## **Female Line**

Pipeline's dam was an outstanding show performer herself and has thrown a continuous line of top show performers. Her 11 registered crias include six separate broad ribbon winners, several of these being the result of matings with Pucara Allegro (S) (SW) – a breeding cross that obviously produces outstanding results.

## At Stud

Pipeline has sired only 18 registered crias, but has produced several useful show performers including three separate broad ribbon winners:

This small number of progeny has, so far, precluded Pipeline from making a major impact as a dam sire. He does, however, have the potential to make a mark in this category. Based on the quality of his half- and full siblings, matings of Pipeline's daughters to Pucara Allegro (S) (SW) should be an interesting, and perhaps profitable, exercise. Such matings would also emphasise the Amador – Cadete cross which has proved successful elsewhere.

## DISCLAIMER



These comments are made on the premise that show results are an independent, objective and accurate manner of assessing the quality of alpacas. This approach is not universally accepted, as there are many reasons why an alpaca might not be taken to show. Also, some critics suggest that judges tend to make assessments on “fashionable” criteria, which can change from time to time. So, there are arguments against using show results, and these should be acknowledged.

We have physically inspected very few of the animals assessed and are unable to make any comment on factors such as fertility, fitness, size and colour (some colour descriptions are inaccurate). Those alpacas receiving show awards at any level are assumed to have an acceptable conformation, free from disqualifying faults.
